In the name of god Amen the xijth day of January in the year of our Lord god
a thousand five hundredes and threescore & threescore I Jennet Hall of Keighley in the countie of yorke
wedowe beyng sick & crased in my bodie yet nevertheles of good and penyte mynde do make my
laste will & testaments in manner & forme followinge first I give & bequyre my soule to
allmightie god trustinge to be saved through the merits of his deere sone Iesus Chryste and my bodie
to be buried in the southe quene wig in the churche of Keighley Item I bequyre to my son Willm
Hall one dry fatte one counter & one chest standinge in the hall and one arke standinge in the parlor

lackinge a cover Item I gyve & bequyge my sone John Hall the elder comonly called Great John
one bushel of ote meale Item I gyve & bequyge to my sone Robt Hall my coffen standinge in the
Upper Chamber and all my gold & silver playte and Jewelle herein whatsoever my greateste
brasse potts & my beste kitchin Item I gyve & bequyge to my sone xpofer Hall my leaste brasse
potts Item I gyve & bequyge to my danghter Janet Leace my greateste pan Item I gyve &
bequyge to my danghter Katherine Sugden my nexte greateste pane Item I gyve & bequyge to
my danghters Margaret Hall Janet Leace & Katherine Sugden & to Agnes Hall my sones
danghter & Isabell Leace my danghters danghter all the Residewe of myne apparrell equallie to be
devided amonge hem Item I bequyge to the said Isabell Leace one blacke why wig calfe and as
muche carsey as wilbe for a gowne The Residewe of all my goods moveable & unmoveable my debts

& legace beyng paid and my funerall expence discharged I gyve and Bequeythe to Willm
Hall Johu Hall the younger comonly called little Johu Richard Hall myles Hall Robte hall &
epofer hall my sone and to margaret Hall & Katherine Gygden my danghters & Agnes
Hall my sone danghter equallie to be devided amongste them And I mayke the said Robte hall
my sone my sole executor These beyng witnesse hereof Willm Hall Johu hall the elder Adam
Widdopp & Margaret Gmyge
